Inclusion: Participating in PCA Caregiver Support Program, Self-report providing care for someone with Alzheimer's

Exclusion: Paid caregiver to their family member

Convenience sample

Recruitment and additional methods to consider:

How will you collect the data for your study (Mail/Web-based/In-Person/Combination...)?

In person

o If applicable, are you meeting the participants in their home or having them meet you in the community?

I will do home-visits to complete the interviews

- When, where, and how will your data be collected:
 - Are you doing this nationally or a certain state/city/agency?

One agency (PCA)

O How will you inform people about your study?

I will mail flyers, and ask service coordinators to tell their clients about the project

• Will it be a one-time survey or will there be multiple parts?

Multiple (at start of service and after receiving services) - pre-test/post-test research design.

o If applicable, what is your intervention?

Participating in the caregiver-support program.

o Are you offering any type of compensation?

No compensation is being offered.

- What will your consent process look like?
 - o Written/verbal?

Verbal and written, I will describe the project and provide a written consent form for participants to sign.

o Will you have additional resources available?

- Will you be using research assistants to help with your project?
 - Will it just be you, or a team, collecting the data? Are you using community members, academic colleagues, or agency staff to collect/analyze the data?

I will have an assistant, two MSS students assisting in the interviews because it is a large agency/sample.

They must be a current MSS/MSW student or have a social work degree. I will also have at least one team member that speaks Spanish for participants that wish to complete the interview in Spanish.

o If applicable, what training will you offer the research assistants?

I will provide education on the Caregiver Burnout Survey – specifically on administration of the survey and scoring. I will also provide a training on Alzheimer's disease and the Caregiver Support Program.
