



Deciding on a Program

Check out the Approved Programs list. What countries and/or programs stand out to you?

What do you want to study while abroad? Do any of these programs connect with your interests?

Do you want to take courses in English only, in a foreign language, or both? Note that if you travel to a country where the local language is not English, you will have to take at least one language course.

Consider different kinds of programs: direct enrollment, exchange, and third-party. Learn more about these with the “Types of Programs” doc on Moodle.

Where do you want to live while abroad - in a homestay or student apartments/dorms? Would you be comfortable if you needed to secure your own housing? Compare the options between the programs that interest you.
