HARRITON HOUSE

The Harriton Association is the 501c3 not-for-profit that was established to protect and preserve historic Harriton House. We work under an agreement with the Township of Lower Merion to interpret, provide programming for and preserve the historic site which was once home to Charles Thomson, Secretary to the Continental and Confederation Congresses. Harriton House was built between 1702-04 by Welsh Quaker immigrant Rowland Ellis who named his house Bryn Mawr after the home he left in Wales. The house sits on 16 acres left from the original 700. The Association offers guided tours, educational programming, and maintains a small herd of farm animals which are very popular in the community.
