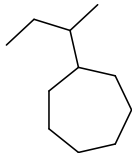
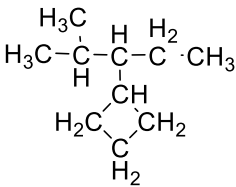
a) Draw the structure based on the name given.

b) Offer the correct compound name based on the rules that we discussed in class.

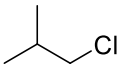
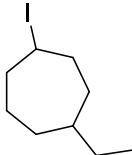
i) 3-tert-butylheptane	ii) 1,3,3-trimethylcyclopentane	iii) 6-methyloctane

2. In problem #1, identify all the quaternary carbons in these structures by writing 4° C next to them.

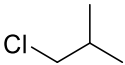

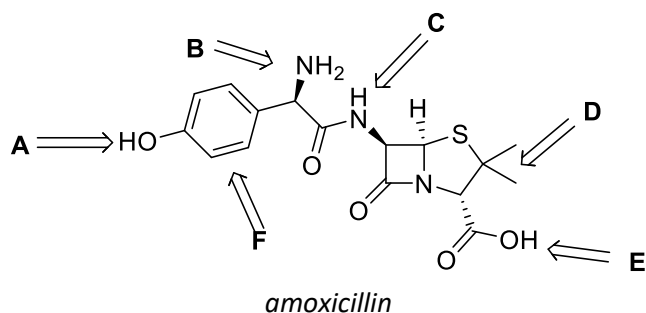

We didn't talk about the nomenclature of halogens or halide groups on alkane structures (Klein waits to introduce alkyl halide nomenclature to Chapter 7), but they operate the same as alkyl substituents. F-, Cl-, Br- and I- groups are given the prefix fluoro-, chloro-, bromo- and iodo-; and the appropriate number based on the same rules used for methyl-, ethyl-, isopropyl-, etc. Given that information, name or draw the following compounds based on the prompt.
